this book argues that the concepts of neoliberalism and neoliberalisation while in common use across the whole range of social sciences have thus far been generally overlooked in planning theory and the analysis of planning practice offering insights from papers presented during a conference session at a meeting of the association of american geographers in boston in 2008 and a number of commissioned chapters this book fills this significant hiatus in the study of planning what the case studies from africa asia north america and europe included in this volume have in common is that they all reveal the uneasy cohabitation of planning some kind of state intervention for the betterment of our built and natural environment and neoliberalism a belief in the superiority of market mechanisms to organize land use and the inferiority of its opposite state intervention planning if anything may be seen as being in direct contrast to neoliberalism as something that should be rolled back or even annihilated through neoliberal practice to combine neoliberal and planning in one phrase then seems awkward at best and an outright oxymoron at worst to admit to the very existence or epistemological possibility of neoliberal planning may appear to be a total surrender of state planning to market superiority or in other words the simple acceptance that the management of buildings transport infrastructure parks conservation areas etc beyond the profit principle has reached its limits in the 21st century planning in this case would be reduced to a mere facilitator of market forces in the city be it gentle or authoritarian yet in spite of these contradictions and outright impossibilities planners operate within contribute to resist or temper an increasingly neoliberal mode of producing spaces and places or the revival of profit driven changes in land use it is this contradiction between the serving of private profit seeking interests while actually seeking the public betterment of cities that this volume has sought to describe explore analyze and make sense of through a set of case studies covering a wide range of planning issues in various



countries this book lays bare just how spatial planning functions in an age of market triumphalism how planners respond to the overruling profit principle in land allocation and what is left of non profit driven developments

when new fellows join my lab i give them some reading materials so that they can orient themselves in their assignment in a new field when fellows leave my lab some after writing their dissertations i prefer to give them a book as a symbolic present i was longing for a book that contained something on more or less everything about the islets at the same time i wished it contained information as recent as possible there are a few

such books in the market but they are pretty outdated i started picking islets myself from october 1990 when i joined the rolf luft center karolinska institutet over the years my fascination for islet research remained high since last year i felt a stronger urge to do more for these mysterious and hidden mini organs that are directly or indirectly involved in the pathogenesis of all forms of diabetes that affects 250 million people in the world after i launched the islet landesbioscience com journals islets and founded the islet society isletso ety org there was a momentum that could be utilized to create something equally meaningful i e this book the idea cracked in september 2008 starting september 19 2008 i contacted an estimated 90 of the authors who published anything on the islets during 2007 2008 and who could be traced from the internet

countries which take spatial planning seriously should take planning law and property rights also seriously there is an unavoidable logical relationship between planning law and property rights however planning by law and property rights is so familiar and taken for granted that we do not think about the theory behind it as a result we do not think abstractly about its strengths and weaknesses about what can be achieved with it and what not how it can be improved how it could be complemented such reflections are essential to cope with current and future challenges to spatial planning this book makes the often implicit theory behind planning by law and property rights explicit and relates it to those challenges it starts by setting out what is understood by planning by law and property rights and investigates theoretically and by game simulation the relationships between planning law and property rights it then places planning law and property rights within their institutional setting at three different scales when a country undergoes enormous social and political change when there is fundamental political debate about the power of the state within a country and when a country changes its legislation in response to european policy not only changing institutions but also global environmental change pose huge challenges for spatial planning the book discusses how planning by law and property rights can respond to those challenges by adaptive planning by adaptable property rights and by public policies at the appropriate geographical level planning by law and property rights can fix a local regime of property rights which turns out to be inappropriate but difficult to change it questions whether such regimes can be changed and whether planning agencies can make such undesirable lock ins less likely by reducing market uncertainty and if so by what means

this book is drawn from diverse studies that grapple with black middle class experiences
