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Converting 5 Feet 9 Inches to Meters: A Comprehensive Guide

Method 2: Converting Feet and Inches Separately, Then Adding

This method involves converting the feet and inches to meters separately and then summing the results. While potentially slightly less accurate due to rounding at each step, it's a useful alternative. Step 1: Convert feet to meters: 5 feet is equal to 5 ft 0.3048 m/ft = 1.524 meters. Step 2: Convert inches to meters: 9 inches is equal to 9 in 2.54 cm/in = 22.86 cm. Converting centimeters to meters: 22.86 cm / 100 cm/m = 0.2286 meters.
